Bob Malone was named chairman and president of BP America Inc. effective July 1, 2006. He is BP's chief representative in the United States. He is based in Houston, Texas where BP business units are involved in oil and natural gas exploration and production, refining, chemicals, supply and trading, pipeline operations, shipping and alternative energy. In the US, BP owns over \$40 billion in fixed assets and employs some 37,000 people. The company is the nation's largest producer of oil and natural gas and the second largest gasoline retailer.

Mr. Malone was raised in the Northeast Texas town of Daingerfield. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Metallurgical Engineering from the University of Texas at El Paso, and was an Alfred P. Sloan Fellow at

the Massachusetts Institute of Technology where he received a Master of Science in Management.

Mr. Malone has served on the California Climate Action Registry Board of Directors, and was a member of the Board of Regents for the University of Alaska system. He has been selected for the Board of Trustees of the National Urban League, the Foreign Policy Association, and the Board of the National Petroleum Council. In addition, he is currently on the Executive Committee for the American Petroleum Institute (API), a Director of the Greater Houston Partnership and a member of the Business Roundtable. He recently accepted an invitation to be a trustee on the board for the Museum of Science and Industry in Chicago.
